2001 Certified (CLG) and Non-Certified Local Government Grant Awards

<i>Grants</i>	<i>Project Description</i>
\$4,200	<u>Barber Creek Study</u> : The ECU Department of Anthropology conducted three interrelated studies of the Barber Creek site on the Tar River in Pitt County. Rated as unique to the Coastal Plain, the site needs further investigation to provide important information to evaluate its significance for possible listing in the National Register.
\$6,000	<u>Cape Fear River Archaeological Survey</u> : The City of Fayetteville developed a comprehensive Municipal Archaeological Survey of lands along the Cape Fear River. This survey is needed to facilitate planning as new development continues to encroach along the river. (CLG)
\$9,000	<u>Forsyth County Archaeological Survey</u> : The Forsyth County Joint Historic Properties Commission developed an archaeological site database for Forsyth County. This database will facilitate the integration of archaeology into public planning projects. (CLG)
\$8,400	<u>Chapel Hill Survey Update</u> : The Town of Chapel Hill and the Chapel Hill Preservation Society conducted a municipal survey update. The last comprehensive survey was conducted in the 1970s and the town is experiencing unprecedented growth as well as the adoption of a new UNC campus plan. (CLG)
\$6,000	<u>Concord Municipal Survey Update</u> : The City of Concord updated its 1979-1980 architectural survey in order to provide a context from which to evaluate and nominate properties to the National Register. (CLG)
\$6,000	<u>Alamance County Survey Update</u> : Alamance County updated and expanded its 1977-1978 architectural survey in order to identify and evaluate potential landmarks and to develop local preservation goals. (CLG)
\$4,600	<u>West Main Street & South Aspen Street Historic Districts</u> : The City of Lincolnton prepared National Register nominations (NRNs) for the West Main St. and S. Aspen St. neighborhoods encompassing approx. 123 structures. (CLG)
\$7,500	<u>Mecklenburg County African American Resources Survey</u> : The Charlotte-Mecklenburg Historic Landmarks Commission conducted a comprehensive survey of approx. 500 African American historic buildings and sites (including approx. 25 neighborhoods) in Mecklenburg County. (CLG)
\$5,000	<u>Roanoke Park and Vanguard Park Historic Districts</u> : The Raleigh Historic Districts Commission prepared NRNs for the Roanoke Park and Vanguard Park neighborhoods in Five Points. (CLG)

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- \$2,500 Lee Avenue Historic District: The City of Sanford prepared a National Register nomination for the Lee Avenue neighborhood. (CLG)
- \$5,000 Mitchell College Historic District Boundary Expansion: The City of Statesville expanded the Mitchell College Historic District (NR 1980) (CLG)
- \$15,600 Wilmington Historic District Survey Phase III: The City of Wilmington completed a comprehensive survey of the downtown historic district (NR 1974). Previous grant-supported surveys encompassed areas north and east of the district. This third and final survey addressed approx. 750 properties within approx. 80 blocks south of the 1974 district boundaries. (CLG)
- \$6,000 Hoyle House Restoration: Hoyle Historic Homestead, Inc. removed a water-damaged 1950 kitchen addition from the Hoyle House that was listed in the National Register in 1993. The historic structure was then stabilized and weatherproofed.
- \$6,000 Villa Place and Edgemount Historic Districts Boundary Expansions: The City of Rocky Mount conducted comprehensive architectural surveys in the outlying areas of two existing National Register-listed districts, Villa Place and Edgemount. (CLG)
- \$3,000 Harnett County Comprehensive Survey Phase I: This project is Phase I of a comprehensive survey of Harnett County, a once rural county adjacent to the booming Research Triangle. This in-house Phase I survey component provided the foundation for a survey sponsored by Harnett County and funded in part by a Transportation Enhancement Act for the 21st Century (TEA-21) grant.
- \$3,600 Downtown Greenville Historic District: The City of Greenville prepared a National Register nomination for the downtown business district. (CLG)
- \$6,000 New Bern Historic District Boundary Amendment and Additional Documentation: The City of New Bern updated the Downtown Historic District National Register nomination prepared in 1973. (CLG)
- \$2,700 Winfall Historic District: The Perquimans County Chamber of Commerce prepared a National Register nomination for the Winfall historic district.
- \$10,100 Manteo Survey Update and Phase I of a Dare and Currituck Counties Survey: Outer Banks Conservationists, Inc. conducted a Manteo Survey Update and Phase I of a multi-phase architectural survey of Currituck and Dare Counties. Phase I is the completion of the Roanoke Island portion of the proposed total survey.
- \$6,000 Scotland Neck Historic District: The Town of Scotland Neck prepared a National Register nomination for the downtown historic district.
- \$2,000 Joint Commission Training Conference: The Historic Resources Commission of Asheville & Buncombe County conducted the Year 2001 training conference for historic preservation commissions. It was the first joint training effort by the North and South Carolina HPOs. (CLG)
- \$1,980 Lenox Historic District: The Hendersonville Historic Preservation Commission prepared a National Register nomination for the Lenox Historic District.(CLG)

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\$5,000	<u>East Marion-Belvedere Historic District</u> : Historic Shelby, Inc. prepared a National Register nomination for the East Marion-Belvedere Historic District. (CLG)
\$1,400	The Jones County Historical Society, in cooperation with the Trenton Beautification Committee, conducted a structural evaluation of the 1924 Trenton School, a contributing building in the Trenton Historic District (NR 1974).

\$12,600	<u>Wachovia Country Congregation Survey</u> : Old Salem, Inc. will conduct an archaeological study of the three remaining unstudied lots of the colonial Town Lots of Wachovia including the Country Congregations of Hope, Friedberg, and Friedland.
\$11,000	<u>Rural Landscape Preservation Project</u> : The Town of Cary will conduct a Rural Landscape Preservation Project surrounding the National Register-listed Green Level and Carpenter Crossroads historic districts.
\$8,500	<u>Chapel Hill Survey Manuscript Preparation</u> : The Town of Chapel Hill, in cooperation with the Chapel Hill Preservation Society, will prepare a manuscript for publication of the architecture and history of Chapel Hill and the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill.
\$8,000	<u>Richmond County Survey Manuscript</u> : The Richmond County Historical Society and the City of Rockingham will prepare a manuscript of the results of the Richmond County survey.
\$6,800	<u>Thomasville Historic Preservation Commission Design Guidelines</u> : The City of Thomasville will prepare design guidelines to address changes to the city's locally designated historic districts and landmarks.
\$8,500	<u>Wake Forest Historic District</u> : The Wake Forest Historic Preservation Commission will prepare a National Register nomination for the Wake Forest Historic District.
\$3,900	<u>Sunset Park Historic District</u> : The City of Wilmington will prepare a National Register nomination for the Sunset Park Historic District.
\$8,500	<u>Edenton Historic District National Register Historic District Survey</u> : The Town of Edenton will conduct a survey as Phase I of a project to expand the Edenton Historic District that was listed in the National Register in 1973 and expanded in 2001.
\$7,200	<u>City of Washington Historic Preservation Design Guidelines</u> : The City of Washington will prepare design guidelines to address changes to the city's locally designated historic districts and landmarks.
